

## **Dangerous Goods**

**Dangerous goods** are items or substances that may pose a risk to **health, safety, property, or the environment**. These goods are defined and classified according to the **IATA Dangerous Goods Regulations (DGR)**.

Fly Air 41 policies and procedures for the transport of dangerous goods are based on international and national regulations, including **ICAO standards, EU aviation regulations, and Croatian national legislation**.

In general, **passengers and crew are not permitted to carry dangerous goods in their baggage**. Only certain items are allowed under specific conditions in accordance with **IATA DGR provisions [DGR-67-EN-2.3.A](#)**.

## **Passenger Information**

Passengers are informed about **items that are forbidden on board aircraft** during the booking and check-in process. Information may be provided in **text, pictograms, electronic form, or verbally**.

The transportation of vehicles powered by lithium batteries is strictly forbidden.

Electronic vehicles with lithium batteries are not allowed in either checked baggage or carry-on baggage on aircraft. This regulation applies regardless of the battery's capacity.

Examples of such vehicles include:

- Hoverboards
- Segways
- Airwheels and Solowheels
- Baggage scooters
- E-bikes with lithium batteries

**Wheelchairs or other mobility aids powered by lithium batteries are exempt from this prohibition but must be declared.**
